Old Business

- Crane Drainage Project construction of the drainage swale along Crane is complete (tree
 and stump removal, drainage swale construction, additional paving touch-ups in the park,
 and wing-wall construction at the basin outlet); discussions re: parking along Crane and
 other areas of the Park are ongoing; lights and irrigation work is being completed by Park
 staff. The Board thanks to Chris Loschiavo for his help in this project
- Pool Deck Replacement BCCA has multiple proposals in-hand for concrete replacement, electrical ground bonding, ladders and other appurtenances, and replacement of the chainlink fencing at a total cost of \$70,647; motion to approve by Herwig, seconded by Thimm; all in favor

New Business

None at this time

Resident Issues

- Unit 234 (Schwanback) suggested installing signage at the pool regarding thunderstorm safety
- Units 141 (Jeffers), 162 (Messina), 139 (Tarone) acknowledged the Crane work; discussed options regarding converting Crane to one-way traffic and allowing parallel parking for up to 20 spaces
- Unit 293 (Patterson) questioned whether poor vegetation behind Unit 298 was caused by spraying of weedkiller; Mike Pangburn responded that while the area is barren, it doesn't appear to have been sprayed; Mike Pangburn will contact Unit 298 to verify whether what, if anything, was used
- Unit 92 (Lichenwalner) commented on the migratory geese on the lake in the fall; Mike Pangburn discussed migratory vs nesting geese; Dave Herwig commented that removing vegetation near water's edge seems to limit that number of geese and amount of time they spend on beach areas
- Unit 83 (Dubois) commended the Board on lake cleanliness; questioned why the lake fountains now shut down at 4 pm; Theresa DeCero responded that they were being shut down early as a cost-saving measure; next summer the lake fountains will run from 8 am to 11 pm (consistent with Bayberry quiet time)
- Unit 93 (Anderson) questioned the \$11,000 increase in electric cost in 2019; Hugh
 DelBorello responded that the increase was not caused by increased usage, but by increases
 in the rates charged by AC Electric; the Board is investigating alternate energy supplier
 costs. Also questioned the Condo fee increase; the increased funds will be used to fund
 upcoming R&R projects (pool deck replacement, road repairs, etc.) without depleting our
 R&R reserve
- Unit 98 (Thomas) commented that a small annual fee is preferable to a large assessment

• Unit 149 (Roma) – inquired about getting WIFI hot spots throughout the park; this has been investigated and unsuccessfully tried in the past; Dave Tarone volunteered to look into this item with Comcast.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:52 am; motion by Herwig, seconded by Finlaw; all in favor.
